#### **MODERA**

Modera Kierland is a six (6) story (includes private rooftop mezzanines) luxury rental residential and retail community that will add high quality dwelling units along the Scottsdale Road Corridor in a unique mixed-use development. Modera Kierland is located on 6.8 gross acres (5.69 net acres) at the southwest corner of the intersection of Scottsdale Road and Paradise Lane.



The KCA has begun discussions with the developer but has not made any formal recommendations. We will keep residents updated on any community meetings and public hearings scheduled.







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#### **DAVIS PROJECT**

Davis Kierland is a proposed luxury multifamily residential community on a 4.21-acre site located at the southwest corner of the intersection of 71st Street and Marilyn Road.

Davis Kierland will hold up to 261 dwelling units with associated private residential amenities.

#### KCA CHAIRMAN'S LETTER





The Kierland Community Alliance was formed to carry out the mission to protect and preserve the character of the Kierland neighborhood, with its ample open spaces, and wonderful views of the sky and surrounding mountains. for the benefit of existing and future residents. We are a small group of residents who volunteer our time to this end, working within the zoning process with re-developers, their agents, city officials and city staff.

It has been busy this year, as Kierland and nearby areas are at the center of the bullseye for redevelopment, especially for, multifamily buildings.

Did you know that currently, there are four apartment complexes under construction on 71st and Scottsdale Road north of Kierland Blvd.? A fifth is in the zoning application process, and another site on 71st is earmarked, but has yet to file an application. Others are in the pre-construction or the pre-application phases south of Kierland Blvd., and include an approved commercial office project on the SE corner of Marilyn and Kierland, an approved apartment project on the SE corner of Kierland/Greenway, a shopping center re-development project at East Thunderbird Square south which includes residential apartments (pre filing status), and an apartment re-development on Marilyn and 71st St. (also pre application status). These many projects flow from the need for additional housing in Phoenix to accommodate the influx of thousands of new residents every month, and the natural attraction of the Kierland area with its shopping, dining, and commercial offices, and businesses.

From our very first engagement, our preferred form of interaction, is dialogue and collaboration vs. opposition, unless, absolutely necessary. We seek constructive, early dialogue with re-developers. Our goal is early engagement to inform and influence their project designs to conform with the character of Kierland; and to minimize the negative impact on current residents caused by excessive height, density, traffic increases, insufficient open space allocation, and unattractive design of exterior facades, among other things.

We know, early, constructive interaction with re-developers can produce positive results for the neighborhood. To date, doing this, we have increased open spaces, reduced height where open space options and adjacencies demanded it, generated re-developer funding for traffic mitigation studies to ensure safety and congestion are properly managed, and promoted changes in projects to mitigate the impact on adjacent single family, and multi-family developments.

We will continue to be vigilant on behalf of the Kierland Community in 2022. It's what we do. We encourage you and area neighbors to be part of this process by keeping up to date through our new website and communicating directly with us and City staff.

### Message from Our Councilman

CITY OF PHOENIX COUNCILMAN JIM WARING REPRESENTS DISTRICT 2 WHICH INCLUDES THE KIERLAND AREA.

Dear Kierland Community Alliance,

I hope you're having a wonderful holiday season! The district I represent covers the area from the Paradise Valley border south of Shea, north along Scottsdale Road to Carefree Highway, west across I-17, and drops back down. We have more miles of street than any district in the city - of the 5,000 miles of streets, we have approximately 705. District 2 has wonderful amenities, from the Musical Instrument Museum and the Sonoran Preserve to the Mayo Clinic and, of course, Kierland, to name just a few.

As a council member, I'm basically part of a board of directors; we hire a City Manager to be our CEO, and he or she hires the 14,000 city employees who provide the backbone for our services and infrastructure. The City of Phoenix owns and runs such diverse operations as Sky Harbor Airport, the Water and Public Works departments, and the Phoenix Suns Arena. Our overall budget is roughly \$4.5 billion every year.

Obviously, in these trying times, we've had our challenges. I'm doing everything possible to ensure our police force is adequate to the task of protecting all of us. Unfortunately, even though the city has raised the police budget, recruitment and retention of officers has become a major issue. Our 2,750 officers make approximately 1.2 million contacts with the public every year. They carry a heavy burden, and they deserve our respect and support. If you get the opportunity, please thank our officers for the sacrifices they make on our behalf - that would be my wish for this holiday season. I wish you and yours a blessed holiday season and I hope you have a wonderful 2022!
